## **Code of Conduct / set of rules for Young People**

Westhoughton Cricket Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of all its members.

Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with Maudine Morris The Clubs Child Welfare Officers.

As a member of Westhoughton Cricket Club you are expected to abide by the following junior code of conduct:

- All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable kit – cricket kit if available or jogging bottoms and trainers– for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager.
- Members must pay any fees for membership, training sessions, matches or events promptly.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
- Junior members must refrain from unruly behavior.
- Junior members must not swear or be abusive to others.
- Don't drop litter at our ground or anyone else's ground.
- Always warm up before training sessions and matches.
- Help the coaches with the equipment before training sessions, matches or events.
- Help the coaches to clear the equipment away after training sessions and matches.
- Always positively encourage team mates.
- Be punctual for training sessions, matches or events.
- Always treat girls as equals.
- Always listen to coaches, team managers and umpires.
- Respect other clubs officials, players and supporters.
- Regularly attend training sessions.
